

Love is a Three-Way Street

I have mental list of the most challenging cities in which I have driven. Believe it or not, neither New York, London or Paris top the list. But near the top, second only to San Juan, Puerto Rico is the city of Boston. So you can understand why I resonate to this account from Zack Hunt, "Faith is a three-way street," from his website *Ministrymatters.com*, June 23, 2017.

One of the great challenges that faces any new driver in downtown Boston is the plethora of one-way streets. ...

So, you can only imagine the excitement my youth group and I felt when the driver of the tour bus didn't look at his map, found himself momentarily lost, and in his haste ... turned down a narrow road only to be greeted by oncoming traffic.

Thankfully, we all survived. ...

Two-way streets are not only a lot more accommodating to lost travelers, they lend themselves well to metaphor, particularly when it comes to personal relationships.

Marriage, we're told, is a two-way street. It needs both partners communicating, working together, sacrificing together, dedicated together in order for the marriage to work. ...

The Christian faith often gets tossed into the two-way street pile as if Christianity were a two-way street between us and God. In a tradition like evangelicalism with its heavy emphasis on a personal relationship with Jesus, the two-way street imagery seems particularly fitting.

Unfortunately for pastors looking for an easy metaphor this Sunday, our relationship with God isn't a two-way street. It's a three-way street.

I know, I know. Three-way streets aren't a real thing, but neither is Christianity that only exists in a relationship between us and God.

Authentic Christianity -- the sort of Christianity that incarnates the life and teachings of Jesus of Nazareth -- is practiced in relationship with God and our neighbors.

To put it another way, we are called to share the love we find in our "vertical" relationship with God in all of our "horizontal" relationships with each other. One more way of avoiding being "so heavenly minded we're no earthly good!"

Meeting called to Order at 7:00pm by President Jay Froehlich.

- Motion made, 2nd and passed to approve the agenda.
- Members shared “highs & lows”
- Pastor Keith led us in bible study (1 Cor. 13) & prayer

March Minutes

- Motion made, 2nd and passed to approve the March Minutes as amended. Correction: Gerri Eberle was absent from March 12th meeting.

March Treasurer's Report

- Judy Mendelsohn presented financial reports for February and March. She will submit a January financial report to the May Council meeting.
- Motion made, 2nd and passed to accept Treasurer's Report as written.

Pastor's Report

- Car crashed through church's front block wall Friday, March 31st around 11pm. TPD called tow to remove car. Church mutual has been notified. Thanks to Ken Luthro, Ron Petri and friends Joe and Mike, and Jack Garner for cleaning up broken block out of the parking lot on Saturday morning.
- Attendance to both Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services showed a 50% increase over last year.

Old Business

- **Rummage Sale** – A success. Vickie announced that we received over \$1,100. By 4pm every item left over was packed & picked up by members of Tierra Del Sol association to use for their upcoming rummage sale in April.
- **AZ Builders Association** – decided to help another non-profit this year. Thanks to Pastor for contacting them about necessary repairs and upkeep on our buildings. We can submit a request again next year.
- **Roof Repairs** – After consulting with Tony's Roofing, Durazo's Roofing and TNE Roofing it was decided to go with TNE roofing approved to fix all roofing issues, including strip down & replace roof and fix gutter problems. Approx. 6-8 weeks repair time, can begin immediately. Strong recommendation to remove problem palm tree from court yard which clogged drain with debris in as little as a week.

- Passed Unanimously
- **Moving Members to Inactive Status**
 - Motion to make a statistical adjustment to the church rolls by removing inactive members made by Gerri
 - 2nd by Tim
 - Passed Unanimously
- **Fellowship Hall Bathrooms** – Peeling paint, graffiti on wall, and normal wear necessitates work to be done. A sign-up sheet for volunteers to supply materials and assist in needed renovations will be posted by Jay.
- **Easter Flowers** – Mark purchased two Easter lilies for the altar. Recommend give congregation earlier & clearer information about monetary memorials in lieu of flowers for future Christmas and Easter.
- **Back Up for Office Computer** – Bill Froehlich has found a program and will purchase it within the next few weeks.
- **Mistake on the February minutes** - found by Gerri that pastor's salary was not increased but approved. Minutes to be corrected.

New Business

- **Idea for increasing our awareness in the community...**
 - **Open House** – suggested by Sharon Garner to increase community awareness of Abounding Grace as more than a church. Invite CAP, scouts, others to participate. Paul Surhoff suggested November for event. Need volunteers to create a team to coordinate. CAP would like visit our congregation some Sunday. Need to make more of effort reaching neighbors to the south and east of church.
- **Ideas for increasing funds...**
 - **Fry's Community Partners** – percentage of sales can be donated to church. Bill will bring laptop on Sunday to help walk members through the registration process after church.
 - **Amazon Smiles Program** – percentage of sales can be donated to church for those shopping on Amazon.
 - **Walk-a-Thon** – volunteers willing to walk a route in our neighborhood as a fund raiser for our church.
 - **Interest Earned** – currently we earn less than half a percent. Research needed to find a better solution to increase our interest earned
- **Credit Check** – not necessary for a business or a non-profit
- **Corporation Commission Report** – due before 5/25, Judy is in process of completing.

Abounding Grace Council Meeting – April 9, 2018

- **Termite Inspection Report** – No termite activity viewed in Main building or Fellowship Hall. Small colony found in shed, but less than last year.
- **Sunday, March 25th Emergency Meeting re: sewer** – El Coronado had our plumbing back on within 20 min on Saturday, March 24, night but it was only a temporary solution. Sewer line clogged with sludge. Necessary *hydroscrub* procedure completed on Monday, March 26th. Procedure has a 5 year warranty. Cost \$3,183 which includes the \$379 charge for emergency service already rendered. Motion made by Walter, 2nd by Tim, voted unanimous to approve this expenditure.
- **State Elections** - will be held in Fellowship Hall in August and November. Church receives \$300 for the use of our building.
- **Wall Repair/Decoration** – Pastor will contact Ron Petri for recommendations for bids on repairs. Mark suggested a welcoming sign to be placed on wall along with repairs. Tim suggested contacting the schools in our neighborhood as a community project. Church would need to approve design beforehand. Signs that run parallel to a road are hard to view. Signs are better when perpendicular to a road and printed on both sides for best visibility.
- **CAP, 1st Lt. Wendy Iskiyan** – will be doing rocketry classes in Fellowship Hall with about 30 youth on 3 upcoming Saturdays, April 28th, May 19th, and June 9th from 8a.m. – 3p.m.
- **Tree Removal** – need company recommendations and cost estimates for consideration for removing the large palm tree in the courtyard.

Motion to adjourn was made, 2nd and approved. Meeting adjourned at 9:03pm

That's why Jesus spent his time teaching the disciplines how to live in the present- how to love, heal and change the lives of those around them through the power of his Spirit. That is how the "kingdom within" is shared with others. But the kingdom, although a present reality, was a future-coming experience. Perhaps this is the kingdom about which the disciples now inquired. What a disappointment to be told that the timetable was none of their business.
